GENERAL STATEMENTS.

LOCATION.

The School is located within the corporate limits, half a mile from the center of the town. Athens is centrally located with reference to North Alabama, on the main line of the Louisville and Nashville Railway, equi-distant from Nashville and Birmingham. Its elevation is nine hundred feet. It is justly reputed one of the healthiest localities in the State. It is an old town, with an established reputation for social, moral, and religious culture. The denominations having church buildings and holding regular services are Methodist, Baptist, Presbyterian, Episcopal and Christian. There are no open saloons in the town and none nearer than thirteen miles.

GROUNDS.

These consist of the School Grounds and the Experiment Farm. The former contain about thirteen acres, six of which is sward, covered with a beautiful grove of original growth enclosed with a hedge of sage orange, in the midst of which the School Buildings stand. The remaining seven are devoted to Experiments and Gardens.

The Experiment Farm is less than half a mile distant from the School at the junction of the Huntsville and Decatur roads. It comprises one hundred and fifty acres, one hundred of which are cleared and in cultivation, the remainder woodland and meadow.

EXPENSES.

At its meeting in the city of Montgomery June 6, 1906, the Board of Control of the Eighth District Agricultural School passed a resolution fixing the Matriculation Fees in the Agricultural School Grades at \$4.50 per term of 18 weeks, strictly in advance and the President was instructed not to enroll or matriculate any pupil until said fees were paid, or arrangement satisfactory to the President was made for their payment.

Board in President's family, including furnished room, fuel and lights, per term of $4\frac{1}{2}$ scholastic months, payable in advance, unless by special agreement, \$60.00.

Each boarding pupil furnishes sheets, towels, toilet articles and blankets.

Boarders are treated in all respects as members of the family, and are expected so to conduct themselves.

No deduction will be made from regular terms save in cases of protracted sickness (one month and over); and payments must be made in advance, either in cash or note bearing interest.

In cases of suspension or expulsion for wilful violation of the rules, no deduction will be made.

Board in private families from \$8 to \$12 per month.

REGULATIONS.

Absence from recitations and other regular exercises of the school will be recorded by teachers and officers and reported to the President.

Attendance upon Sunday School and religious services on Sunday is required.

LITERARY SOCIETIES.

There are two Literary Societies in the School—the Lee for boys, and the Houstonian for the young ladies.

These societies meet once a week, and every pupil will be required to join these societies and to take part in their work.

CHURCH PRIVILEGES.

The leading Christian denominations have organiztions here, and pupils will be allowed to attend the church of their choice.

DISCIPLINE.

Our discipline is intended to put the pupils upon good behavior, to lead them to see the importance and necessity of good government in all phases of society, and thus to govern themselves. We have found by many years' experience that boys and girls, with but few or no exceptions, can be governed by appealing to the higher and better part of their natures, and that when this plan fails it is more of an evidence of the want of necessary qualifications in the teacher, than it is that the pupil could not have been thus controlled. When a bond of sympathy and love has been established between the teacher and the pupils, we have found that discipline and government are easily established and maintained. Obedience to the laws of the school-room must be had: when the moral suasion idea fails, we must try other plans. Our pupils are constantly impressed with the fact that they are preparing themselves to take their places in the world as real citizens, with real duties to perform. They are, therefore, taught that life after they are out of school should be and will be a continuation of the life they live in a schoolroom. They are trained to honor and respect authority, and to give cheerful obedience to the laws under which they may live.

AGRICULTURE.

One of the main objects in establishing the Agricultural schools was to teach the science of Agriculture, and we have put into our regular course of study a thorough course in Horticulture, Floriculture and Agricultural Chemistry. The aim is to give those who take this course a practical and scientific understanding of the

chemistry of the soils and fertilizers, and enable them to apply the same to the practical operations on the farm and garden. In addition to the regular class in Agriculture, the entire school will have the advantage of lectures on this subject.

THE AGRICULTURAL SCHOOL.

This department is composed of four grades, comprising a four years' course.

By resolution of the Board of Control, pupils in the Agricultural School must spend two hours per week, the boys on the School Farm and the girls in the School Garden, where they will put in practice what they learned from the text-books.

We want to educate our boys and girls for the farm and not away from it, for "he who can grow two blades of grass where one grew before is a benefactor to mankind."

ELOCUTION DEPARTMENT.

Miss Annie B. Grass has consented to take charge of the class in Elocution and will give lessons at \$3.00 per month. Class Lessons \$1.00 per month. Miss Grass is a graduate in Elocution of the Athens Female College and her splendid work and success as a student is an earnest of her success as a teacher.

UNIVERSITY AFFILIATION.

The Eighth District Agricultural School is affiliated with the Southwestern Presbyterian University at Clarksville, Tennessee, and awards each year a scholarship to the same. The University at Clarksville is an institution of established record and is the only institution of its kind in the Mississippi Valley.

The University of Alabama and Alabama Polytechnic Institute at Auburn admit our graduates to Junior year, upon their diplomas and certificate from the President.

The University of the South at Sewanee will give our graduates full credit for what they have done in any course in that Institution. Other Universities and Colleges of high grade will take our graduates upon Certificate from the President.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION.

To be eligible for graduation in this school the candidate must complete the full course as prescribed by the Board of Control and be in possession of an Alabama. First Grade Certificate to teach in her Public Schools, and must be of good, moral character.

TEACHERS COURSE.

Teachers desiring to obtain State Certificates will find it to their advantage to study a while with us.

Our pupils have been very successful in obtaining Certificates. Most of the teachers in Limestone county holding First and Second Grade Certificates have been our pupils or have attended our Summer School for Teachers. Out of 25 teachers who received Certificates January, 1906, 13 of them were our pupils.

MILITARY.

Com. W. H. McClellan took charge of the cadet corps late in the winter. The boys soon improved in carriage and deportment as all the male students of the Agricultural School were under military rule and discipline.
